Golden Steer is a cool steakhouse that's old Vegas and has a cool story. Peppermill is a must see for a true Vegas-style diner. Piero's is old school Italian (and some scenes from Casino were filmed here.) Herbs & Rye is also a fabulous steak house with an old school, speakeasy vibe. They also have 1/2 off steaks all the time.

A hike at Red Rock Canyon is great for awesome views. While you're out that way, drive into Blue Diamond and stop at the Cottonwood Station cafe.

If you want some of the best French cuisine on the water, where you don't feel like you're in Vegas, Marche Bacchus is where it's at. Nacho Daddy is always a fun time if you're just looking for margaritas and a ton of food (multiple locations.) I also love all of the antique and retro shops downtown in the arts district. Good Cajun food is Lola's. Tivoli Village is a neat spot to bar hop around.
